Academic Courses (Coded 1D)	<p>Academic courses focus on the essential concepts of the discipline plus additional related concepts. Academic courses develop students' knowledge and skills by emphasizing theoretical, abstract applications of the essential concepts while incorporating practical applications.</p> <p>Academic courses will be phased out as new de-streamed courses are developed.</p> <p>These courses are intended to prepare students for the Grade 10 academic (D) subject course, which leads to all grade 11 and 12 courses including college (C), university (U), university / college (M), and workplace preparation (E) courses in Grades 11 and 12.</p>
De-streamed Courses (Coded 1W)	<p>De-streamed courses equip all students with the knowledge, skills, and habits of mind to be successful in academic or applied courses in grade 10.</p> <p>The Halton District School Board and the province of Ontario are moving to a de-streamed grade 9 program. De-streamed courses will replace and combine academic and applied courses. For courses not yet de-streamed the academic course will be offered.</p>
Open Courses (Coded 1O)	<p>Open courses in Grades 9 and 10 are offered in all subjects other than those offered as Academic, Applied, or Locally Developed. An open course has a set of expectations that is suitable for all students at a given grade level. These courses are designed to provide students with a broad educational base.</p>
eLearning Courses (Coded with a last character of 'O')	<p>Grade 9 Building the Entrepreneurial Mindset (BEM 100) is being offered as an eLearning course for Grade 9 students. In this course, students will learn what makes an entrepreneur thrive and the skills required to succeed in today's business environment. Students will begin to develop their own entrepreneurial mindset, and learn why it's important to take initiative, adapt to change, find creative solutions, and understand the financial considerations of entrepreneurship.</p> <p>The course will be delivered by an HDSB teacher in an asynchronous, online environment. This means that students will work individually through the online material delivered through Brightspace. Students will have a period in one of their semesters designated as their time to work on this course.</p> <p>It is recommended that students selecting eLearning courses have strong learning skills in self-regulation, organization and time management.</p>

***FSF 101** - This French course is an option for students who have less than 600 hours of core French instruction in elementary school.

Note: If a Technology course is not taken in Grade 9, it must be taken in the Grade 10 year as this is a graduation requirement.
