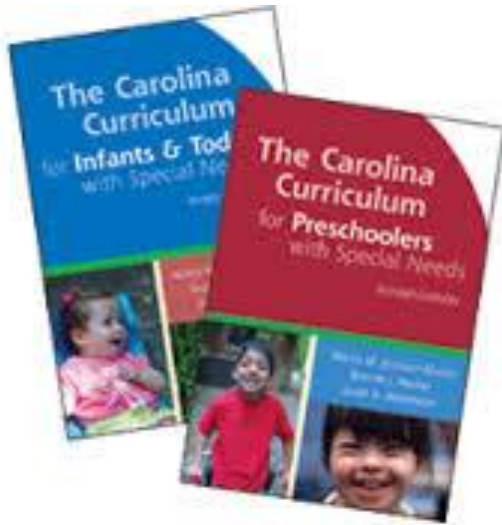

# Community Pathways Program

- 7 year program
- Work to foster independence
- Functional academic skills
- Functional life skills
- In-School Co-ops (Cafe and Breakfast Club) - 3 years
- Community Co-ops (Pizzaville, Sobeys) - 3 years



# Our Space

- 6 designated CPP classrooms
- Most of these classrooms have a kitchen
- 2 sensory rooms
- 4 quiet rooms
- 2 fully equipped accessible washrooms
- Stalled washrooms nearby





# Community Pathways Program

- Non-rotary homeroom (4) - same students, same room all day - 2 teachers
- Partial-rotary homeroom (2) -am same students in same room, afternoon different teacher/different students -up to 3 teachers

All classes are self-contained classrooms and are taught by a self-contained classroom teachers unless specified.

# Box Office Cafe

- School store
- Sell student made snacks
- Money used to support our program - transportation to Community Co-op opportunities, graduation
- Provides in-school Co-op opportunities
- Greeting customers, sales experience, handling money

# Typical Schedule

- Numeracy and literacy in morning, if possible
- Functional academics, communication
- Active, hands-on activities in the afternoon
- Gym, computers, science
- Co-ops (in-school or community)



# Lunch

- Bring a brown bag lunch
- Buy lunch from the cafeteria
- Eat in cafeteria or classroom (45 minutes)
- EAs/Lunchtime supervisors
- Technology time, games, activities, free time (30 minutes)



# Regular Activities in CPP

- Library visits (school and community)
- Technology - Smart Boards, Ipads, chromebooks
- Futures Athletic Leagues 3x/year (Intramural sports team)
- Bowling 2x/year (non-rotary classes)



# Communication



- School website
- Emails updates
- Daily Agendas (home communication - student/staff)
- Parent/Teacher interview nights (November and February)
- Email, phone calls, case conferences
- Homeroom Teacher as key contact
