## 2021/2022 Academic Year

### College Eligibility

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent. Applicants with an OSSD showing senior English and/or mathematics courses at the Basic Level, or with Workplace or Open courses, will be tested to determine their eligibility for admission; **OR**
- Academic and Career Entrance (ACE) certificate; **OR**
- General Educational Development (GED) certificate; **OR**
- Mature Student status (19 years of age or older and without a high school diploma at the start of the program). Eligibility may be determined by academic achievement testing for which a fee of \$50 (subject to change) will be charged.

### Program Eligibility

- English, Grade 12 (ENG4C or equivalent) with a grade of 65% or higher.
- Mathematics, Grade 12 (MAP4C or equivalent) with a grade of 65% or higher.
- Biology, Grade 11 or 12 with a grade of 65% or higher.
- Chemistry, Grade 11 or 12 with a grade of 65% or higher.
- All applicants must complete an assessment of their knowledge and skills through the Test Centre, and pay an exam fee. Results from the Algonquin College Health Program Admissions Test (AC-HPAT) will be utilized to establish minimum eligibility and applicant ranking. The AC-HPAT can only be written once per academic cycle. For further information on the HPAT and how to book your assessment, please visit Algonquin's Test Centre.
- Applicants with international transcripts must provide proof of the subject specific requirements noted above and may be required to provide proof of language proficiency.

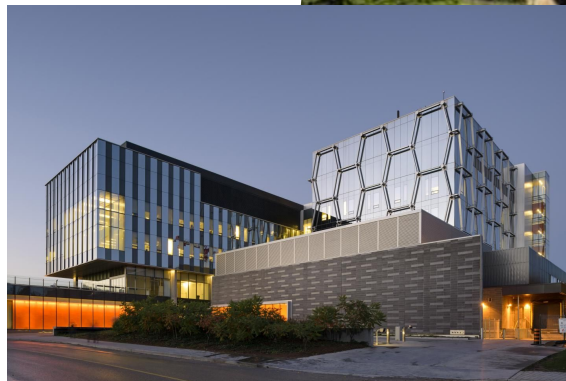

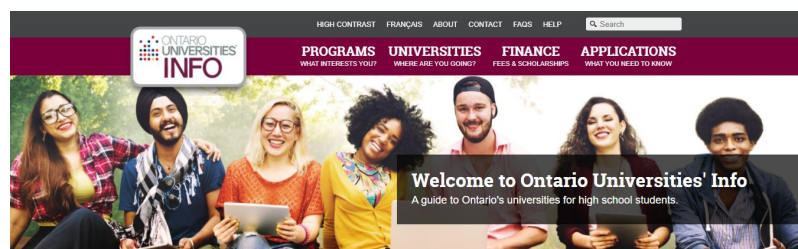

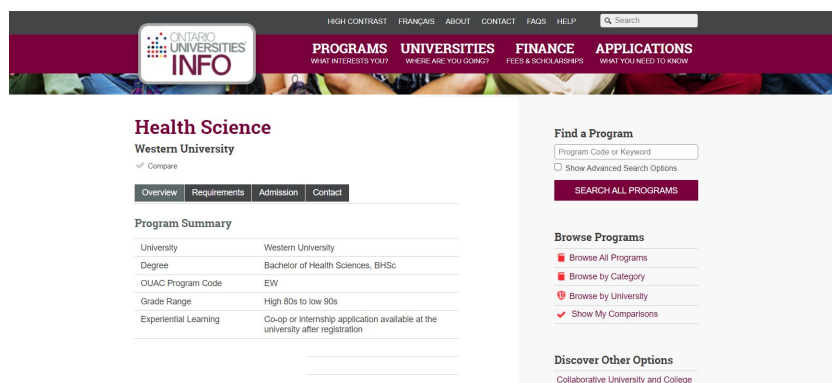

## Grade 12 - IDC4UW - Sports and Entertainment Marketing

A continuation of the Grade 11 Marketing course, the Grade 12 Marketing class takes the 4Ps of Marketing and applies it to the fun and exciting worlds of Sports and Entertainment! Students will engage in creative projects such as designing their own Theme Parks and planning and running their own Promotion Projects - Organizing fundraisers, sporting games and other events designed around their interests and goals. In the past students have also organized Terry Fox Runs and the Miracle on Main school fundraiser.

This is a University Level course and it is recommended that students take either IB20 or BM3C before taking this class.



# Virtual Course Fair

## AVI4M - Grade 12 Visual Art



This course is for students who have successfully completed AVI3M and intend to study art in University College. Students will regularly practice art skills and techniques in class and complete artworks which are presented for critique. A variety of visual art forms are studied including drawing, 2D design, painting, sculpture and printmaking. Students will use a wide range of materials and document their creative process along the way. In a sketchbook, journal and portfolio. During this course the class will analyse the art of past and present societies. Various additional topics include: portfolio development, careers, responsible practices, techniques and conventions. The summative involves an Art Show, Interview, Artist's Statement and Final Exam.

### What is coop?

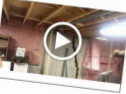
