DONNA	 Criteria Review (Slide 13). Questions on balance of overall enrollment does not mean the same number in all schools, one school should not be severely depleted. Viable number in both English and FI – used a lot in boundary reviews for new schools. This list is not exclusive to other criteria, a lot of the criteria listed comes into play when there is a new school opening. What have we missed – is there any criteria not listed? Will decisions made here affect other Burlington schools? We have not developed any scenarios that affect other schools. There are other schools that have low English enrollment but we want to concentrate on Pineland. Keeping cohorts have kept students together who have been together for years, they can graduate together. The intent of today is the big picture we will fine tune later. 		
MICHELLE & DOM	 14 Scenarios Bottom is enrollment projections Pineland does not have English program students in 2014 Core French in grade 1 – will numbers change. These numbers are based on historic trends Pineland 2014 Boundary Review Lay Scenario 1A – Area above New Street will go to Frontenac All scenarios allow for students to stay at Pineland until they graduate. Does not apply to siblings. All "A" scenario students will go to Frontenac. Does my kid get to stay at existing school? Yes or they could go to Frontenac but no transportation will be provided. This is fine tuning that we can work out later. Gradually move kids to their new schools.

	 Red highlighted projection means we are over capacity. Some scenarios will be off the table. Funding from Ministry – Additions have to go before the Ministry, they may say you have room in other schools. HDSB renovation budget is limited. There are no plans for additions. No specific order for our scenarios OTG = Capacity; Total= OTG + # of portables Cap can depend on class organizations and the number of students vs. OTG Pineland is often the home school so they put their child in FI – parents want both options. Parent was encouraged to try FI. There will be no influx of English students, it is about Pineland being FI. Politics if a student has FI they will get a better job? FI as opposed to buying into that neighbourhood. Creating more FI schools may not solve this problem. If we had FI at Pineland and Frontenac we would still have low enrollment in English. Could we add additional programs to Mohawk i.e. self-contained. Not usually considered for boundary reviews just to fill up space. Break into small groups and go over the scenarios. Don't be afraid to make suggestions. Planning can put together numbers on any suggestion you make.

Liked scenarios 3 & 4 because there was no change for students, one school. If you live west of Appleby they lose the opportunity to walk to school.
