#### 4.1 <u>Superintendent's Report</u>

Superintendent Ruddock shared the following:

- 2024-25 School Year- We have had a successful and smooth start back to school.
- 2. Summer Learning / Support We had a very successful summer learning program this year. In addition to the offerings from School Programs and Gary Allan, SES hosted learning sessions for a range of special education needs and age/grade ranges, including Assistive Technology camps, Structured Reading Intensive, and entry to school programs for students with Autism. The Student Well-Being Department also provided virtual mental health supports

throughout the summer, using our CYC and Social Workers. Finally, our SLPs and Psychoeducational Consultants conducted additional assessments over the summer.

3. **Entry to School - Transitions** - Again this year, the Ministry provided funding for staff to host transition meetings for students with significant special education or mental health needs. These funds were used to support students visiting the school, as well as case conferences with parent/guardian and other key stakeholders to support students who are experiencing greater challenges in returning to school.
