QUESTIONS

Trustee Gray:

Stated that it was good that the process allows potential partners to express interest on a project that is planned for the future and has not been built yet.

Trustee Collard:

Asked what would happen to partners at Robert Bateman (i.e YMCA Daycare) if the school does not close ? Dom Renzella stated in reference to the relocation of the YMCA daycare to Frontenac, it would likely to occur, as the daycare sees that their client base is more related to an elementary school than a high school.

Trustee Reynolds:

Asks what would happen to a partner if the Board needs the space that was given to the partner? Dom explained that the Board would address this in the terms and conditions outlined in the licence agreement during negotiations with the partner.

Director Miller:

Superintendent John Pennyfather is another contact, as one of his roles community partnerships.

Nicole Stephen, Chairperson, Pearson Co-op Nursery School:

How long do the typical lease agreements last for and how is cost recover calculated? Dom Renzella responded that that the terms and conditions of leases are determined on an case by case basis. The cost recovery is based on use of the organization/partner and it is part of the negotiations. THE Board currently charges other daycares in the system around \$7.50 a square foot per year..

Lori Prospero, Executive Director, Owl Child Care Services of Ontario:

Asks what is the process in selecting partners for new schools/co-builds in terms of childcare partners. ? Dom Renzella replied that this would service would be sent out to tender.

Sheryl Delugt, Parent, Pearson

Questions if there are up to nine spaces in Aldershot and it is a "magnet school" why would the Board be filling those potential classrooms with partners? Dom Renzella replied that it would be included in licence agreement if the space is needed by the Board. Adding that there isn't a huge rush in partners

asking for space at this time. A community partner might not need all 9 rooms. Stuart Miller added that the Board would help the partner find the extra space.

Kendra Willard, Health Promoter, Halton Region(Not representing):

Asks if there is specific type potential partner the Board is trying to attract? Dom Renzella stated that we cast a net to see who might be interested. The notification list ranges from childcare providers to universities. Stuart Miller added, partners that might be of benefit to the children in the schools would be considered. As well agencies that would compliment the school. We are ready to accommodate almost any partner, as long as they meet the criteria set out in the Board policy.
