An Overview of the Purpose and Objectives


Glenview - Maplehurst Resolution

Background:

At the December 7, 2022 Board meeting, HDSB Trustees approved a motion to initiate the process to review the Glenview PS / Maplehurst PS boundaries with the intention to provide enrolment relief to Glenview PS. (link to report - link to map).

Board Report Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Halton District School Board direct staff to complete a boundary review for ERA 100 (Aldershot) with the objective of addressing accommodation pressures;




Administrative Procedure Review

Purpose of Boundary Review

The mandate of the Boundary Review Committee will be to review the current boundaries to provide enrolment pressure relief to Glenview PS, and balance the distribution of students in Aldershot for the long term with consideration to planned development in the area.







Evaluation Criteria


Criteria to Evaluate Options

Criteria to review options include but no limited to:


Viability of Programs: Can programs be successfully maintained at the school?	Proximity to schools: Are safe walk-to opportunities maximized?
Stable Long Term Boundaries: Is there long term stability and avoid a another boundary change in the short term?	Balance of Enrolments: Is access to programs, resources, extra curricular opportunities being maximized? Can over/under utilization be avoided?
Portable and Portapaks: Is the use of portable classroom minimized?	Transportation: Is this option cost effective for transportation?
Fiscal Responsibility: Does this option avoid unnecessary costs?	Student Experience: Does this option reduce the number of moves? Are cohorts kept together?

Boundary Maps and Zones

- The study area was divided into eleven (11) zones. Two sub zone were created for analysis. (Eb, Hb)
- Zones represent a geographic area, that encompases a community and/or neighbourhood bound by physical features (e.g. roads, creeks).
- Combination of zones are created to develop boundaries for different options.
- Students that fall within the zones may be subject to a change to their home school.







Max Capacity (OTG + Portables)


On-The-Ground (OTG) Capacity










Status Quo - Transportation

Transportation Highlights:


- 1. Glenview PS: Approximately 250 students eligible for transportation.
- 2. Glenview PS: Three (3) large bus and three (3) minibus routes.
- 3. Maplehurst PS: Approximately 220 students eligible for transportation.
- 4. Maplehurst PS: Six (6) large bus and two (2) minibus routes.
- 5. Two (2) large bus and two (2) minibus routes are combined between the schools.

Current Boundary - Projections




Status Quo Summary:

- 1. Projected to increase above functional capacity by 2023.
- 2. 2023 Glenview PS is projected to require seven (7) portables.
- Projected to increase above 140% utilization by 2025.


Shortlisted Options (2/2)

Option 3 - Boundaries

Option Summary:

- 1. Students south of Plains Rd to remain at Glenview PS.
- 2. Students north of Plains Rd and west of Waterdown Rd to remain at Glenview PS
- Maplehurst PS boundary extended west to Waterdown Rd
- Future development in Aldershot Corners to attend Maplehurst PS
- 5. Phased transition to Maplehurst PS starting with students in grade K-5
- Approximately 75 students to be redirected to Maplehurst PS.




Option 3 - Transportation



Option Summary:

- Small number of students (<10) become eligible for transportation.
- 2. Reduction of two (2) minibus routes and one (1) large bus route at Glenview PS.
- New students to be absorbed into existing Maplehurst PS bus routes.
- 4. Minimal impact on current transportation services.




Option 3 Summary:

- 1. Glenview PS enrolments will remain above 105% utilization.
- 2. Students in grades 6 (2023) will remain at Glenview PS until grade 7

Option 3 Summary:

- 1. Maplehurst PS to enrolments to increase to above 80% utilization, in the first five years.
- Capacity will be exceeded with the development of Aldershot Corners, by 2030.
- 3. North Aldershot development at Maplehurst PS.
- 4. Will receive students from Glenview PS in grades K-5 effective September 2023.



Option 10 - Boundaries

Option Summary:

- 1. Areas north of Hwy 403 to attend Maplehurst PS.
- 2. Areas north of Masonry Ct. and north of Plains Rd between Cooke Blvd and Waterdown Rd to attend Maplehurst PS.
- 3. Zone Eb to attend Glenview PS.
- 4. Areas west of the Cemetery and south of Plains Rd to attend Maplehurst PS.
- 5. Future development in Aldershot Corners to attend Maplehurst PS
- 6. Approximately 80 students to be redirected to Maplehurst PS.






Option 10 - Transportation

English Program Boundary

Option Summary (under review):

- No changes to bussing eligibility for students.
- 2. Reduction of (3) minibuses and one (1) large bus at Glenview PS.
- Increase of approximately one
 (1) large bus at Maplehurst PS
- Minimal impact to transportation services.



Option 11 - Boundaries

Option Summary:

- 1. Area north of Plains Rd is redirect to Maplehurst PS, except Zone Eb.
- Future development in Aldershot Corners to attend Glenview PS, Maplehurst PS
- Phased transition to Maplehurst PS starting with students in grade K-5
- Approximately 90 students to be redirected to Maplehurst PS.








