
Criteria to review options include but not limited to:

Viability of Programs: Can programs be successfully maintained at the school?	Proximity to schools: Are safe walk-to opportunities maximized?
Stable Long Term Boundaries: Do projections show long term stability and avoid the need for additional boundary changes in the short term?	Balance of Overall Enrolment: Is access to programs, resources, extra curricular opportunities being maximized? Can over/under utilization be avoided?
Temporary Accommodation (Portables): Is the use of portable classroom minimized?	Transportation Requirements: Is this option cost effective for transportation?
Fiscal Sustainability: Are unnecessary costs avoided?	Student Experience: Does this option minimize the number of student moves? Are cohorts kept together?
Geographic Area and Barriers: Create geographically contiguous boundaries, take into account physical barriers.	Other: Other criteria recommended by the BRSC or BRC



Staff Considerations and Flags:


- Aligning FI cohorts between Oodenawi and Dr. David R. Williams
- Distribution of FI students is not balanced:
 - Munn's and Sunningdale will require portables over the next 10 years where Forest Trail will require none
- Montclair FI cohort becomes split between Munn's and Sunningdale
- Munn's walking community created, but has relatively equal coverage to Sunningdale.



Staff Considerations and Flags:

- Same considerations identified in Option 3a to be considered in Option 3b
- Dr. David R. Williams potentially reaches 18 portables by 2029 due to the school holding areas north of Dundas and east of Trafalgar(Max Capacity reached before tentative opening of Oakville NE #4 in 2030)
- Really tied to the Oakville NE#4 opening, which could get delayed.



Staff Considerations and Flags:

- No schools exceed max capacity before 2030
- Stable boundaries long-term, until new schools open
- Very good distribution of enrolment
- Existing Dr. David R. Williams and Oodenawi Fl cohorts will all move together to one new school facility.
- Increased need for transportation in AI and AH.
- Most High Density moving to another facility.
- No split cohorts in this option.
- Opportunity for some legacy exemptions.

Sandbox Overview



1. Kickstarting a NEW Option with Staff

- 1. Identify the base option to start the discussion (e.g. Option 3).
- 2. Identify the school(s) you wish to modify (River Oaks).
- 3. Take note of the walking web coverage
- 4. All statistics of the school will be provided at the bottom right corner of the screen.



2. Identify which Zones for the School the Option

1. Instruct staff which zones you wish to have assigned to your target school. For English Zones, request the ENG prefixes. For French Immersion, request the FI prefixes.



2. Zones with "ENG/FI-ALT" include a lower ratio of FI students and higher ratio of ENG students in the projection for zones which currently have a dual-track program. These zone buttons will be selected by staff when creating options where there will be no FI programming north of Dundas Street (e.g. Option 3). A lower ratio of FI and higher ratio of ENG students is projected for these options because students are less likely to join an FI program in Grade 2 if they are required to change schools.






- In Option 3, DDRW is changed to an ENG only school. '-Alt' zones are selected.
- A lower number of students are projected to leave the school for FI, so projections include a higher number of ENG students in these zones.
