## Definitions

Social Risk Index

Percentage of lone parent families
An index calculated from nine census variables that measure education, employment, income, reliance on government-subsidized incomes, unemployment, family structure, mobility, language, and immigration that has been created by Statistics Canada. For each of the nine variables, a risk factor is considered "present" if the neighbourhood has a higher score for a variable than the Ontario average. The score of 9 indicates highest risk, and a score of 0 indicates lowest risk.

Percentage of Census families with a lone parent, i.e. "a mother or father with no spouse or common law partner present, living in a dwelling with one or more never-married children" (Statistics Canada).
Percentage of low income families, adjust- A fixed percentage ( $50 \%$ ) of median adjusted after-tax income of households observed at the person level, adjusted to household need. The ed to need
