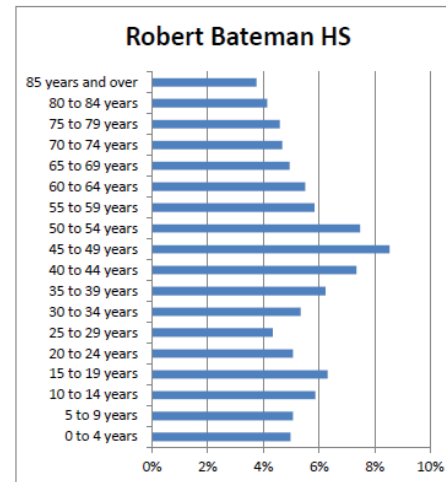
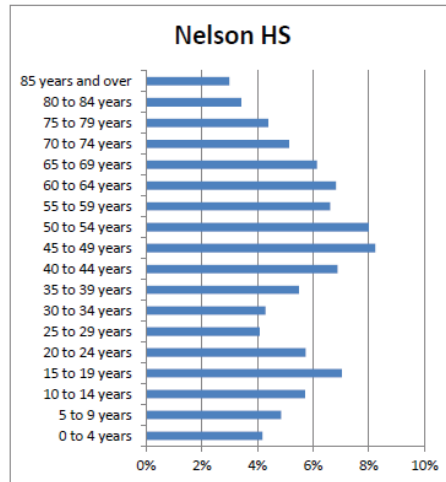
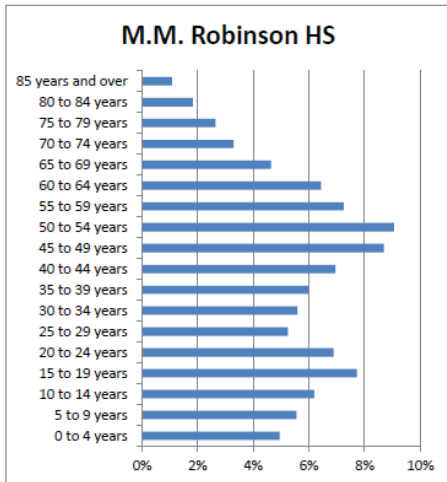
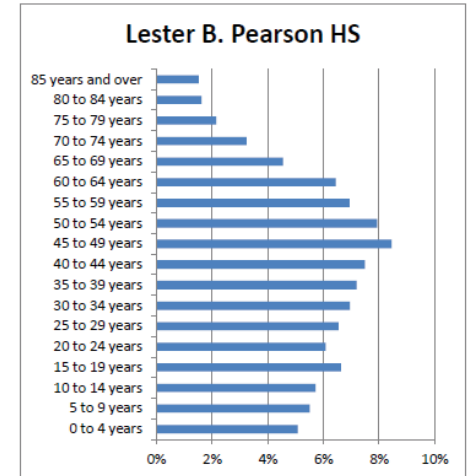
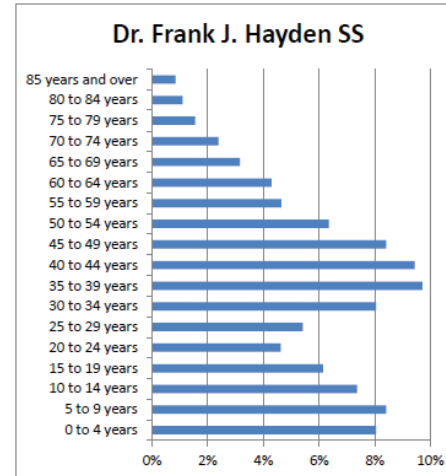
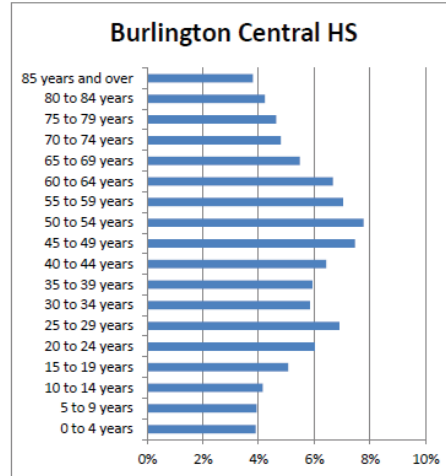
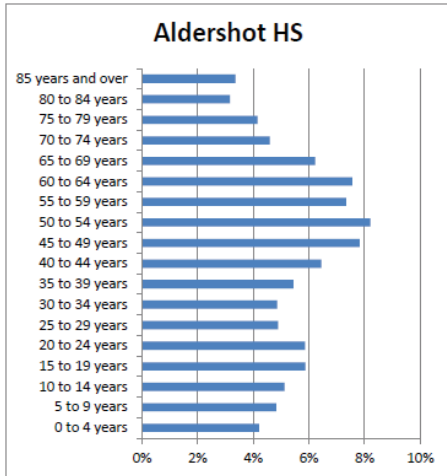


SIP 4.1.4—Age Distribution

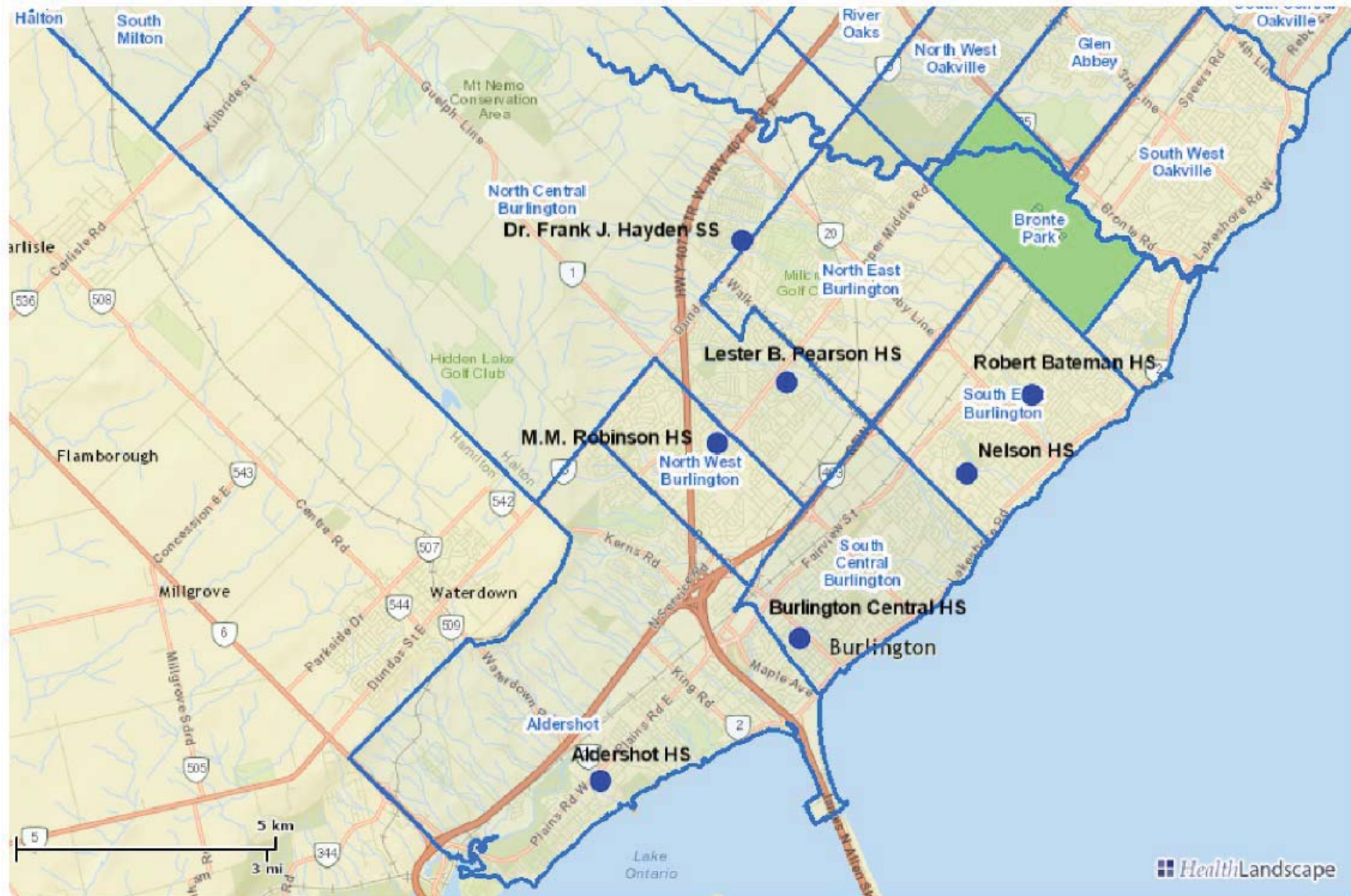

Definitions

Social Risk Index	An index calculated from nine census variables that measure education, employment, income, reliance on government-subsidized incomes, unemployment, family structure, mobility, language, and immigration that has been created by Statistics Canada. For each of the nine variables, a risk factor is considered "present" if the neighbourhood has a higher score for a variable than the Ontario average. The score of 9 indicates highest risk, and a score of 0 indicates lowest risk.
Percentage of lone parent families	Percentage of Census families with a lone parent, i.e. "a mother or father with no spouse or common law partner present, living in a dwelling with one or more never-married children" (Statistics Canada).
Percentage of low income families, adjusted to need	A fixed percentage (50%) of median adjusted after-tax income of households observed at the person level, adjusted to household need. The adjustment takes into consideration that a household's needs increases with the number of household members (Statistics Canada).
Percentage of families whose mother tongue is not an Official Language	Percentage of families where the first language learned at home in childhood and still understood by the person is not English or French.
Percentage of recent immigrants	Percentage of families that have immigrated to Canada within the last 5 years.
Percentage of families that rent	Percentage of families that rent their home.
1-year mobility rate	Percentage of the population that lived in a different address one year prior to the address indicated on Census Day.
Unemployment rate	Percentage of the population, aged 15 or older, that were without paid work or without self-employment work and were available for work during the Census reference period (Statistics Canada).
Population aged 25-64 years old with no diploma, degree or certificate	Percentage of the population between the ages of 25 and 64 who have not obtained any certificates, diploma, degrees or equivalent (Statistics Canada).
Percentage of families receiving government transfer payments	Percentage of economic families that have received any government transfer payments.
