It compares a facility's total five year renewal needs to the cost of rebuilding the facility. A higher FCI indicates greater renewal needs and therefore can be considered to be of poorer condition. The FCI index is the cost of rebuilding a school to its current building, not to rebuild to 2016 standards.
